Henry S. Marcinuk, 92, of Methuen, MA. passed away on Saturday morning, June 6, 2020 at Holy Family Hospital. He was the son of Konstantin and Dorothy Marcinuk and the loving husband of Lee Marcinuk, who preceded him 7 years earlier.

He was born in Meriden, CT and moved to Lawrence in the late 1930's. He met his future wife Lee at Lawrence High School where he left prior to his senior year to serve in the U.S. Navy during WWII. He returned to school and graduated a year later. They were married in 1948 and remained so for 64 years until her passing in 2013.

He also served in the Korean War and returned to Lawrence where he settled and started a family. He was a licensed pipe fitter and oil burner technician and worked at Cyr Oil and J.A Leone in Lawrence before retiring from Whaleco in Dracut.

He was a devoted father and is survived by three sons, Wayne and his wife Jin of Marlborough, Glenn and his wife Denise of North Andover and Cory of Methuen who took care of him until his passing. He also has two granddaughters and several nieces and nephews.

He was a devout member of St. Anthony Maronite Church and a supporter of many charities. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus and was a frequent regular at the Methuen Senior Center. He will be sadly missed by all that knew him.
